## **SJJ Faculty**

St. John's Jesuit has 73 faculty and administrative members who hold four doctorate degrees, 39 master's degrees, and 29 bachelor's degrees. The student to faculty/administrative ratio is 13.5:1.

## **Grade Point Average**

At St. John's Jesuit, a student's grade point average is calculated based upon all courses taken in high school, excluding physical education and the SAT/ACT prep courses. In evaluating a student's grade point average (GPA) the following factors should be noted:

- Students are admitted selectively.
- Students are not ranked.
- Advanced Placement and Honors courses are weighted. (AP = 1.0 Honors = .5 with a C or better).
- Approximately 95% of all St. John's Jesuit graduates continue their secondary education at colleges and universities.
- St. John's Jesuit does not report disciplinary history on either the transcript, or on the Secondary School Report.


## St. John's Jesuit Graduation Requirements


### **Community and Christian Service**

As a Jesuit school, SJJ believes in developing strong ethical and human values. Community and Christian Service are a part of our curriculum. This requirement begins with 10 hours of service for Freshmen; 15 hours of service for Sophomores; and 20 hours of service for Juniors. Students have the opportunity to choose from a variety of experiences on a local, regional, national and international basis.

## **Senior Project**

Every Senior student must complete a three-week, career-related or volunteer field experience under the direction and supervision of a faculty advisor. Students develop their own plan, set goals for the project, and present this Senior Project to a faculty committee. At the conclusion of the Senior Project, the student is required to write an in-depth report on his experience and learning. In addition, his findings must be presented before a faculty board for final review and approval.
