

ST. JOHN'S JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL & ACADEMY

FOOD ALLERGY POLICY

Under the Ohio House Bill 1, amended Ohio Revised code, Sec.3313.719, listed below are the guidelines which will be followed by St. John's Jesuit High School & Academy to ensure the safety of students with peanut or other food allergies.

- The school nurse will obtain a detailed health history for the student and discuss familial concerns.
- Each student with a food allergy will have an individualized care plan on file, reviewed annually with the parents. The parent/guardian must review and sign the plan authorizing the school to disclose medical information with the staff as necessary.
- Continued collaboration with parent/guardian, teachers, and healthcare providers to address continuing student's needs.
- Train staff as needed on a student specific basis to administer the emergency plan. Provide Epi-pen/TwinJect training and other guidance having to do with life-threatening food allergens, symptoms, risk reduction procedures and emergency procedures.
- Work with school staff to modify the student's environment to ensure the his safety in all areas of the school.
- Distribute the medical alert to teachers.
- A peanut and nut free table is available to the student body in the cafeteria.
- Epi-pens will be kept in the Health Office.
- Special consideration will be taken on field trips and Epi-pens will be kept with the student's parent or school teacher. Medical emergency papers will travel with the student on these occasions.
