SJJ Students Serve as Mentors for The Chuck Ealey Foundation

The Chuck Ealey Foundation is a non-profit organization that was established in 2010 as a mentoring program for elementary schools in Toledo. St. John's Jesuit High School students, as part of the Christian Service program, work at the elementary school level with young students at Rosary Cathedral, Queen of Apostles, Martin Luther King Academy, and Lake Erie Academy in Toledo.

Each high school student serves as a mentor in a one-on-one relationship that helps the young student build his or her self-esteem. Students meet with students during school hours once a week over a six-week period. The young students are encouraged to develop qualities that are considered to be "undefeated" including eliminating negativity, and building determination, encouragement and endurance, focus and fortitude, equality, attitude, tenacity, education and discipline.

The Chuck Ealey Foundation is named for its founder. Mr. Ealey, a native of Portsmouth, Ohio, was raised by a single mother. He attended Notre Dame High School and as a star quarterback led his football team to 30 consecutive victories and a state championship. He was recruited as a quarterback to play for the University of Toledo where he dominated the field during an undefeated college career winning 35 straight games. Eligible for the NFL draft in January 1972, Mr. Ealey's stellar record was not enough to earn him quarterback in any one of 26 pro teams.


Disappointed, but "undefeated," he was recruited by the Tiger Cats of Hamilton, Ontario, and went on to play seven seasons professionally as a quarterback with the Canadian Football League.

After his football career, Mr. Ealey went on to become a successful financial advisor and motivational speaker. Now, his dream is to help children with potential through his foundation and a grassroots program called the *Undefeated Spirit Pilot Program*.

According to Mr. Ealey, all kids are at risk without the right information. "There are kids that show wonderful leadership qualities, but without fostering them along, they could go in the wrong direction."

SJJ Christian Service Director Phil Skeldon serves as an educational advisor to the foundation along with Mrs. Shelley Jackson, A+ Learning Center Tutor, and Mrs. Mary Ann Ransey, 2020 Program Coordinator. All three help recruit student mentors for the program. Mrs. Jackson and Mrs. Ransey helped to create the curriculum that the students use on their resolutions.

"This is Chuck's dream to give back to Toledo, a community that he values because of his successful collegiate career. Chuck is a very humble man and a wonderful role model. He has worked hard to become a success. He relates to young people who are struggling and he wants to provide them with additional support to keep them focused on success," Mr. Skeldon said.





Five SJJ Swimmers to Compete in State Championship on February 23






SJJ Academy Stars in 'The Fabulous Fable Factory' on February 25 and 26


