One of the greatest athletic stories of all time is the story of Roger Bannister. He was the first person to run a mile in under 4:00. Before this accomplishment, people scoffed at the idea of any person running a mile in under 4:00. The race itself had a great story and tradition. Throughout human history, all had failed to break the 4:00 mile mark. Even some physicians publicly claimed that this feat could not physically be accomplished. On May 6, 1954, Bannister proved the critics wrong. He ran the mile in 3:59.4 in front of 3,000 spectators. He had accomplished an amazing first and allowed people to believe. One month later, another runner broke the 4:00 barrier, and from that point forward over 700 runners have broken the 4:00 barrier. These athletes did it because Bannister allowed them to believe.

The power of belief is an athlete's greatest mental asset. At St. John's Jesuit, we believe that athletics is an integral part of our mission. True success is when a student puts his heart and soul into the game and then walks off the playing field as a better person. 

years of playing experience with two D-II professional rugby teams, the Toledo Celtics and the Cleveland Rovers


Assisting Coach Novak will be Douglas Leavitt, who has 14 years of experience as a professional rugby player for the Toledo Celtics.





Titan Hockey Skates Through Season with 24 Wins

Head Hockey Coach Mike Hayes considers this year's Hockey record "overall a good year" with 24 wins, 9 losses, and one tie. "We're always pushing hard to play to our potential. As a coach, I always know that we can do better. I want the team to give their best and there's always room for improvement. This season we can be proud of our record.

"We played in six tournaments counting the conference playoffs. We were in the finals five out of six times," he explained. "Most of our losses were at games held on Sunday afternoons. I have to wonder why we are struggling with Sunday games."


