## The Power of Belief



One of the greatest athletic stories of all time is the story of Roger Bannister. He was the first person to run a mile in under 4:00. Before this accomplishment, people scoffed at the idea of any person running a mile in under 4:00. The race itself had a great story and tradition. Throughout human history, all had failed to break the 4:00 mile mark. Even some physicians publicly claimed that this feat could not physically be accomplished. On May 6, 1954, Bannister proved the critics wrong. He ran the mile in 3:59.4 in front of 3,000 spectators. He had accomplished an amazing first and allowed people to believe. One month later, another runner broke the 4:00 barrier, and from that point forward over 700 runners have broken the 4:00 barrier. These athletes did it because Bannister allowed them to believe.

The power of belief is an athlete's greatest mental asset. At St. John's Jesuit, we believe that athletics is an integral part of our mission. True success is when a student puts his heart and soul into the game and then walks off the playing field as a better person. St. John's Jesuit is mission-driven, and our responsibility is to ensure that athletic success is accomplished in a Christ-centered environment; to win in any other manner has no purpose or meaning. The hoopsters played eight games without Austin's point guard and leadership contributions. Because of his commitment to conditioning and workouts during his time off, his return in time for the St. Francis game looked as if he never missed a beat. DJ Bonds '12, Anthony Glover '14, and Alex Carter '12 also have had to fight through injuries. Dilyn Good '13 is trying to recover from an illness in time for the state tournament.

Of course, injuries and illness give others opportunity and players like Tyler Thompson '13, Chris Stearns '13, and James O'Shea '12, who have done a very good job with their extra minutes.

The constant has been the outstanding play of Junior Marc Loving '13.

Marc hit a milestone against Fremont Ross when he went over the 1,000 points career mark. Marc is the ninth Titan varsity basketball player to accomplish this milestone and the first to do so during his junior year. A week later, Marc broke a 30-year old rebounding record held by Don Mewhort '83 when he garnered 21 rebounds against Rogers. Marc has been invited to play in a select All-American game in New Orleans the weekend of the NCAA Final Four!

SJJ Seniors play their final home game on Friday, February 24 when the Titans host Central. Beyond that, the tournament draw for the OHSAA has the Titans playing at Central at 6:15 p.m. on Friday, March 2 against the winner of the Springfield-Start game.
