# Marc Loving '13 Adds to His Achievements

In addition to his numerous other accolades garnered over the last three seasons on the hardwood, Marc Loving '13 can now be called an All-American.

The 6-foot-8 junior basketball standout competed in the All-American Championship in New Orleans on April 1 between the Final Four and national championship game.

As the only junior on the roster, Marc finished with six points for

the North team in the prep allstar showcase. He drained a pair of 3-pointers and scored the first points of the contest for his squad, which ended up losing 86-85 to the South team.

"It's very big and it's very exciting to play with some of the top kids across the country," Marc said. "I really enjoyed the

experience.' The All-American Championship

annually features 40 of the best high school boys basketball players in the country. Last year's inaugural event included 2012 Big East freshman of the year Mo Harkless of St. John's University, ACC all-freshman team honoree Rvan



Anderson of Boston College, and SEC all-freshman team honoree B.J. Young of Arkansas.

"This was a tremendous honor for

Marc," SJJ Varsity Basketball Ćoach Ed Heintschel said. "We couldn't be more proud of him." Additionally, Marc was named Division I co-

player of the year and an AllOhio first-team selection by the Associated Press last month. Marc averaged 22.9 points and

9.0 rebounds per game this past season for the Titans and has verbally committed to continue his studies and playing career at Ohio State. He is SJJ's first basketball player to earn Ohio player of the year honors as a junior. Brian Roberts '04 earned that distinction as a senior.

Marc is also the first All-Ohio first-team honoree for the Titans since B.J. Raymond '05 was honored following the 2004-05 season.

"Marc is a unique talent because of his skill set for a 6-8 player," Coach Heintschel said. "He has excellent perimeter skills, he can score, he is unselfish, he is a terrific shooter. He has expanded and improved his game each year and still has an upside in that he can continue to develop as a player."

### SJJ Camps Keep School Rocking This Summer

It happens every summer at SJJ. Classes wrap and camp begins. Last summer, SJJ hosted more than 900 kids in grades five through nine at Summer FunCamps and Sports Camps.

With one of the most comprehensive camp programs in northwest Ohio, SJJ provides enrichment experiences and athletic skills camps that are directed by faculty and coaches during June, July and August.

Summer FunCamps include Archery, Build Your Own Arcade, Chess, Digital Photography, Fishing, High Adventure, Lego Robotics, and Skateboarding. This year, SJJ has added Drama Camp in collaboration with St. Ursula Academy, four sessions of Lego Robotics I, Lego Robotics 11, as well as a Math and Science Enrichment Camp. Dr. Bryon Borgelt, Academy Principal, is the director of the Summer FunCamps program.

"It's a blast to see kids try new things at Summer FunCamp. It's a great opportunity for kids to get on campus, meet our faculty, and make new friends. SJJ camps are a great value, too. This year, we're offering a 10 percent discount for families signing up for two camps.

## The Power of Belief



One of the greatest athletic stories of all time is the story of Roger Bannister. He was the first person to run a mile in under 4:00. Before this accomplishment, people scoffed at the idea of any person running a mile in under 4:00. The race itself had a great story and tradition. Throughout human history, all had failed to break the 4:00 mile mark. Even some physicians publicly claimed that this feat could not physically be accomplished. On May 6, 1954, Bannister proved the critics wrong. He ran the mile in 3:59.4 in front of 3,000 spectators. He had accomplished an amazing first and allowed people to believe. One month later, another runner broke the 4:00 barrier, and from that point forward over 700 runners have broken the 4:00 barrier. These athletes did it because Bannister allowed them to believe.

The power of belief is an athlete's greatest mental asset. At St. John's Jesuit, we believe that athletics is an integral part of our mission. True success is when a student puts his heart and soul into the game and then walks off the playing field as a better person. St. John's Jesuit is mission-driven, and our responsibility is to ensure that athletic success is accomplished in a Christ-centered environment; to win in any other manner has no purpose or meaning. Our student athletes believe in the St. John's Jesuit mission, and we, as a St. John's Jesuit community, believe in them. Go Titans!

## World as One Plans to Host Chinese Students in Fall 2012

St. John's Jesuit High School will accept five Chinese students for the fall 2012. The Chinese students will be part of the World As One program, founded in 2003. The mission of World As One is to cultivate and establish international relationships in a Christ-centered, supportive learning environment. Students develop an understanding and respect for one another's beliefs, backgrounds, and cultures, creating a life-long community that values and advocates justice and peace in the world.

To date, World As One has had more than 60 students from Spain, Italy, France, Germany, Rwanda, Mexico, Haiti, Japan, Ecuador, Finland,

Hong Kong, Taiwan, Slovakia, Turkey, Lebanon, Switzerland, Russia, Moldova, and Guatemala. Students have lived with local families and attended SJJ for either one year as a cultural exchange student or multiple years as a graduating student.

The Chinese program will accept qualified students who will spend two, three, or four years at SJJ and who are committed to earning their high school diploma from St. John's Jesuit.

At this time, St. John's is actively seeking host families for the Chinese students. According to Mrs. Stacey Wisnieski, Program Director, this is a wonderful opportunity for a family to expand their knowledge about the growing importance of China in our world and expose their son firsthand to a culture he will likely encounter in college and career. "It's a win-win for students and families as families share their daily lives with their international son. We have many examples of how valuable the experience can be for everyone, especially in today's global landscape," Mrs. Wisnieski said.

Host families are not required to commit for four years. They can serve for one or more years and will receive a significant monthly stipend to help offset the costs of hosting. 


# Laxers Persevere Through Eventful Season

The St. John's Jesuit Varsity Lacrosse team entered its 10th season led by Head Coach Mike McComish and 10 Seniors, Captain Jake Borkosky, Captain Ryan Zbikowski, Captain Jake Wheeler, Alex Hock, Jack Wanamaker, David Cassavar, Nick Johnson, Andrew Miller, Tyler Meyers, and Goalie Ross Sattler. The season began with decisive victories over Perrysburg and Anthony Wayne but these wins were followed by losses to St. Charles, Olentangy Liberty, and Hoover. The team rebounded to defeat Erie McDowell from Pennsylvania but then stumbled and lost to Ohio state ranked Medina and Massillon Jackson high schools.

With the tough losses behind them, the Titans recovered and beat Central Catholic in a home matchup but followed that victory with a loss to Southview. Undaunted, the SJJ Laxers traveled to Indianapolis and stepped up to the challenge to play in the Midwest Jesuit Invitational Tournament at Brebeuf Academy. In the first game, SJJ beat Marquette Jesuit, ranked 11th in the state of Wisconsin, which positioned SJJ to play in the championship game against De Smet Jesuit, ranked 9th in the state of Missouri. In a back and forth game, the Titans came out victorious with the winning goal in the last minutes of the game. The following day and in an emotional overtime matchup, the Titans also defeated Brebeuf Academy 11-10, ranked 12th in the state of Indiana, and were awarded the 9th Annual Midwest Jesuit Invitational Father O'Brien Cup.

For the remainder of the season, the team will faceoff against Northview, St. Ignatius, and rival St. Francis which should prove to be a grand finish to an already eventful season.
